The Dental Assisting Program at Mott Community College prepares students for both the Associate of Applied Science and Certificate of Achievement..

Dental assistants are directly involved in patient care, working with dentists. Michigan requires both education and licensure for those persons performing expanded functions on patients. Graduates of this program will complete requirements that qualify them to take the Michigan State Board Examination for licensure as a Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) and the National Board Examination to be a Certified Dental Assistant (CDA).

What is an Early Middle College?

The Genesee County Career and Technical Education Early Middle College (GC CTE EMC) is a unique opportunity for students to explore and earn an associate's degree, credential or transferable credit in a CTE Career Pathway while in high school.

Students will begin blending their high school course work with college level coursework in 11th grade, adding additional college courses in 12th grade and complete a full schedule of college coursework in a 13th year.

What is the MEMCA Certificate?

Michigan Early Middle College Association (MEMCA) Certificate recognizes early middle college students who successfully complete a minimum of 15 college credit hours and 100 hours of verified community service, a minimum of 40 hours of work-based learning or a combination of both that equals a minimum of 70 hours.

SEQUENCE OF COURSES The grades 9-13 sequence of courses includes the Michigan Merit Curriculum Requirements and the required college course work for the listed credentials. See Sequence of Course legend below.

¹Students must place into these courses through a placement test. If a student does not place into these classes, the sequence of courses will be modified for the student's individual plan of study.
